The Two Systems: Understanding Permit Architecture

Employer-Specific (Closed)

The Norm

- Tied exclusively to one employer.
- Tied exclusively to one employer.
- Usually requires an LMIA (Proof no local can do the job).
- Hard to switch jobs; status is linked to employment.
- Most foreign professionals fall here.



Open Work Permit

The Exception

- Allows work for any employer.
- Extremely rare eligibility.
- Reserved for Spouses, International Experience Canada (IEC), or specific graduates.
- High flexibility.



Selecting Your Market: Regional Dynamics

Where you choose to live determines your disposable income and competition level.



Canada's economy is not a monolith. It is a collection of distinct regional hubs. Strategy requires targeting the region that specifically needs your skillset.



While Toronto pays well, Calgary's lower rent and lack of sales tax results in significantly higher discretionary income.




The Execution Roadmap



The Primary Barrier: LMIA

Why this is the main source of friction in the process.



Strategic Implication: Many employers avoid this process. Candidates must verify LMIA willingness early or target exempt streams like **Francophone Mobility** or **International Experience Canada (IEC)**.

Critical Challenges & Strategic Fixes




Challenge: The Canadian Experience Paradox

- **Issue:** Employers hesitate to hire without local references.

Strategy: Treat the first job as a stepping stone.

- Even a short contract creates the “Canadian Experience” metric needed for senior roles.




Challenge: Status Mobility

- **Issue:** On a Closed Permit, you cannot switch employers if unhappy or laid off.

Strategy: Maintenance of status is critical.

- Changing jobs requires a new employer willing to sponsor a new permit.



Frequently Asked Questions



Family Eligibility

High-skilled job offers (TEER 0, 1, 2, 3) often allow spouses to get Open Work Permits. Children can attend public school for free.

Minimum Wage Reality

While \$15-19/hr is legal, major city costs often require significantly higher wages for comfortable survival.

Job Offer Requirement

Yes, you need one. Unless eligible for rare open permits (Spouse/IEC), a specific offer supported by an LMIA is mandatory.
